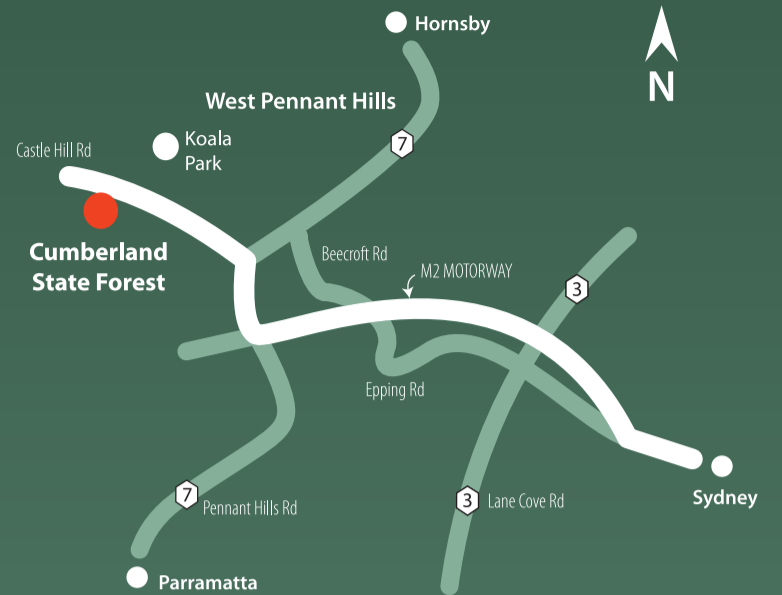


Cumberland State Forest

- By car – Drive along the M2 motorway. Take the Pennant Hills Road exit and head north. Travel 2km, and then turn left onto Castle Hill Rd. Follow the signs for Tourist Drive No.15.
- By public transport – Catch the train to Pennant Hills station then take a bus to Cumberland State Forest.
